

Instructions: Planning early for long-term electric charging infrastructure needs is important for project success. This form was created for the convenience of applicants and utility providers to assist in discussing the potential new zero-emission vehicle/equipment project and infrastructure projects, includinc key components such as anticipated costs and timelines.

The intent of this form is to ensure awareness of all parties involved in the potential new zeroemission vehicle project. This document is not binding, meaning that applicants and utility providers do not need to complete a full utility analysis or otherwise fully commit to proceeding with the potential new zero-emissions vehicle/equipment project as outlined on this form.

The information identified in this worksheet may be used to support the Project Narrative component of the grant application package, but it is **not required**. Applicants may include a copy of this worksheet for each project location included in the application.

Regardless of whether applicants use this worksheet, the EPA strongly encourages applicants to coordinate with their and electric utility providers to determine anticipated costs and timelines. Additionally, applicants should keep fleet electrification expansion plans in mind, as futureproofing for upcoming needs can ultimately decrease overall utility upgrade costs.





CSBP REBATE AWARDS



- EPA has announced the awardees from the 2023 CSBP Rebate funding round.
 - ~3,100 Electric School Buses
 - ~530 School Districts
 - ~67% of funding went to priority districts
 - https://electricschoolbusinitiative.org/statementapproximately-3100-more-electric-school-buses-bringclean-ride-kids-thanks-clean-school
 - This is the third round of funding awarded through the Clean School Bus Program. The initial two rounds, a rebate and grant competition, awarded nearly \$1 billion each, which supported nearly 5,000 electric school buses. With today's announcement, the program has awarded over its lifetime close to \$3 billion in funding to support 1,000 school districts across the country in the purchase of 8,500 cleaner school buses.

FEDERAL EJ STRATEGIC PLANS

- Last October, the White House Council on Environmental
 Quality <u>announced</u> that each Federal agency must create
 Environmental Justice Strategy that describes a plan to integrate
 environmental justice into programs, policies, and activities
 - Under Executive Order 14096, Revitalizing Our Nation's Commitment to Environmental Justice for All
- Federal Agencies are developing Environmental Justice Strategic
 Plans as part of Administration's requirements due this October


